Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) is a program in which free roaming cats are humanely trapped, spayed/neutered, vaccinated for rabies and other feline viruses, and then returned to their outdoor home to live out their lives. TNVR involves a caretaker who provides food, adequate shelter, and monitoring of the cat's health. TNVR has been shown to be the most effective, cost efficient, and humane way of stabilizing the community, feral, and outdoor cat populations.

TNVR days are held every other Sunday; reservations are required. Call **941-366-2404 ext. 301** to schedule!
