Left Behind But Not Unnoticed



A Tiny Ball Of Fur Can Heal Hearts







Grace




You may wonder why you would consider giving bottled water to your cat. Most urinary crystals and stones are made up primarily of minerals. If water that contains those potentially harmful minerals is offered, crystal and stone formation may be encouraged. Tap water and well water often contain minerals along with other UFOs (Unidentified Floating Objects). Providing bottled water, which is more restricted in those minerals, may help. Believe it or not, some very stubborn cases of Feline Lower Urinary Tract Disease (FLUTD) have actually resolved once the affected cat was offered only distilled water. 
