

Cookie is a gentle diabetic cat whose only wish is for a family. Recently she was transferred to a loving foster home to receive proper diet, timely insulin, and visits to a local veterinarian for acupuncture treatments.



Holistic medicine and acupuncture specifically has been practiced on animals for nearly 4000 years. Alternative medicine is not intended to replace traditional veterinary care, but it can produce optimal health results. In some cases the combination of proper diet and acupuncture treatments has reduced or eliminated the need for insulin.

Cookie is hoping the acupuncture will help her diabetes and that her wish for



a family will come true. And why not? Cookie is currently residing with her foster parent and Bow-Tie, spokescat for "Friends Like Me." This Cat Depot program helps provide emergency medical care and treatment to cats who are sick, injured or have chronic illnesses, such as diabetes.

I'm Calvin and this is my buddy Tigger.



Lots of orange cats today, but I'm the one you want. I came to Cat Depot when my owner died, and since then I live in the Executive Director's office.





HOBO'S STORY

As told by rescuer, Sandy Coppa



After finishing our late night holiday shopping at Ellenton Outlet Mall, my daughter approached a cat hiding in the shadows of the busy parking lot. He immediately began purring and rubbing up against her leg. We stopped a security guard to inquire about a late night shelter, but none were open. He recognized the cat as one of the strays the workers often fed. To prevent the unthinkable from happening, our only option was to take the cat home and to call a shelter in the morning. We named the cat Hobo and so began Hobo's journey.

We tried unsuccessfully to capture and keep Hobo from jumping out of our vehicle. Needing assistance, we stopped a police officer and explained our intent. Officer Sarah put Hobo in the back of her police car and we followed her to a nearby store. We purchased a carrier and Hobo willingly allowed Officer Sarah to

transfer him to the crate. He appeared very appreciative of the joint effort.

That evening, Hobo was fed and made comfortable in our home. Afterwards, he jumped into my lap and placed his head against my neck as if he was giving me a hug. My husband suggested that when something jumps into your lap, it was meant to be. We were hopeful Hobo would soon have a place to call his own.

Due to Cat Depot's devotion to cats, we called them the following day. They admitted Hobo, but because he was not microchipped, he was held for seven days. I called daily and was delighted the day I visited to find Officer Sarah also checking on his welfare. We hugged each other and shared in the happiness we felt about rescuing little Hobo.

I am so grateful for people like Officer Sarah who go beyond the



call of duty. I hope my story will inspire people to help rescue pets at risk. There is no greater feeling than knowing you helped save a life.



Hobo's journey ended happily when my family chose to adopt him.


